

YMCA Day Camp Tracy is a state licensed summer day camp program for boys and girls entering grades 1 – 8. The purpose of the program is to continue the YMCA’s mission of offering programs which enhance an individual’s spirit, mind and body. Through activities such as Outdoor Education, Swimming Lessons, Arts and Crafts and other traditional activities, your child will learn new skills, make new friends, and acquire more confidence when dealing with others. Camp Tracy is located on 32 acres of woods, streams and fields and includes lodges and a docked waterfront on beautiful McGrath Pond in Oakland. Camp Tracy has been serving the area’s day camping needs for over 40 years. Campers are transported to camp each day by school bus from the Alfond Youth Center in Waterville.

Camp Fees

\$235.00 per session

A \$25.00 non-refundable deposit is required for each session. Deposits are applied to your camp balance that must be paid *in full* one week prior to camp.

Lunch

Clothing

AGE GROUP INFORMATION

Trailblazers (grades 1-2)

This age group introduces a traditional camp program through age appropriate activities that will nurture and challenge their needs to explore nature. Arts and Crafts, Swim Instruction, Outdoor Education, Music and Drama, and Outdoor Games comprise our “traditional” camp program.

Pioneer Village (grades 3-4)

This age group will continue to participate in all traditional program areas at an intermediate level.

Explorer Village (grades 5-6)

This age group will explore the environment and will include the introduction of new components such as canoeing, water safety, tent camping and archery.

Ranger Village (grades 7-8)

This program contains moderate planning, preparation, and development of the curriculum by seventh and eighth graders. A true outdoor adventure.

Transportation

Transportation to and from Camp Tracy is provided by school busses that leave the Alfond Youth Center each morning by 8:30 a.m. An Oakland bus stop is located at Williams Jr. High School in Oakland. Pick up arrangements by persons, other than parents or guardians, must be written and made in advance with the camp Director. Children must have written permission to walk or ride bicycles to and from pick up and drop off points.

First Day of Each Session

All Campers, including those using the Oakland bus stop, must meet at the Alfond Youth Center in Waterville by 8:00 a.m. on the first day of the session.

Parents Nights / Overnights

On the second Thursday of each session a parent/camper program will be scheduled after camp.

Medical Release / Medication

Every child must submit a completed medical information form. Parental authorization is needed in the event of medical emergency.

Medication that is sent to camp must be in its original container, along with a note permitting administration of the medication by the first aid staff.
